## **REVIEWS and Exhibit/Awards Comments**

Kate Hanson: 'I loved the gripping mood and variety of things to look at and ponder in this portrait'

F. Scott Hess, guest curator: There was a time when finding well-painted figurative works was difficult. There just wasn't that much of it around. But that has changed. It seems there is an abundance of well-painted works at this time, as one sees them too often on Instagram and other social media platforms. In curating this show I looked for works that were not only technically excellent, but also captured my attention in a different way, and made me think beyond the represented figure. This might be political/social commentary, or it might be visually poetic, or intrigue with narrative or humor, or relate to painting's grand history, or deliver a strong sense of what it is to be human. I wanted paintings that delivered a view of existence in today's world. We are living in very difficult times and I expect artists to be saying more about our experience during this period than just reproducing a pretty face or a nice body."

Robert Carsten: With its frontal pose and triangular design, this powerful portrait speaks volumes about its subject. Top lighting serves to delineate expressive qualities within the sitter's hands and face that are simply mesmerizing. Subtle variations in the pose relieve any overly symmetrical qualities and subtle colors and textures of the robe reference the background. A masterful portrait.

Ed Rubin, International writer on the Arts, Culture and Entertainment, greater NY area: *Patricia Schappler's 'Within this Garden'* is a stunning work of art. Technically, it is flawless. The figures are beautifully proportioned, the composition is carefully and intelligently thought out, and the graphite line work, shading, and shadowing are exquisite. Beyond the rhythmic technique, this piece simply reaches out and grabs me, demanding that I study these individuals who, within this garden, are bound together by something bigger than themselves. What is it? My answer changes each time, and that is the genius of Schappler's work.

Bowersock Gallery: Patricia has a preternatural ability for capturing the truth, the essence of a soul in a given moment, and for finding the utter beauty in that second in time. Her works are honest portrayals, straightforward, rarely apologetic, and most often vulnerable, which is why they are so captivating. These are ordinary souls, specialfor the individual lives they live. They are captured in a moment of sheer honesty, staring directly at the viewer or lost in a private inner world. The figures that grace her canvases are poetic and rich with emotional content; romantic, yet gritty and startling. Her figures are also perfectly rendered, each figure a solid, technical accomplishment. Schapplers palette is warm, and the layered hues, shadows and lights breathe life into each figure. (Schappler) is a powerhouse, an exceptional figurative artist, but more importantly skilled at finding the authentic human within that body. http://www.cambridgeart.org/blue-2019/

Courtney Harris & Julia Welch: A remarkably inventive use of various media and textures enlivens and creates intrigue in this work. The patterning with rice paper, making up the form of the seated figure, contrasts with the painterly forms that surround her. Despite the nearly monochrome palette, there is a compelling vitality and emotional expression to this work. (Resuscitation) The emotional connection between sitter and artist ispalpable. The realistic portrayal of face and body provides a compelling contrast with the abstracted forms that surround.

Belle Struck, Chair Governor's Academy: This portrait (Dorothy) confronted me as soon as I saw it. Patricia's adept handling of the medium and subject matter immediately put the viewer in the room with this woman and within the gaze of the artist. The mark making is loose and confident, the composition strong and impressive. This piece continues to speak to me long after I have left the gallery.

Al Miner, assistant curator of Contemporary Art at the Museum of Fine Arts in Boston, MA: We are left to look deeply into this boy's eyes and soul as he begins to look deeper into himself. Wearing sloppy gym shorts he is easy to relate to. We all know this boy, maybe you were him once or maybe you see your now grown son in his stance. Titling the work 'Fourteen' and not the boys name heightens the familiarity. He hasn't grown into his big hands, and while his budding musculature is visible in his torso, his shoulders slightly bow and his eyes expose his softness. The large scale matches his bravado, but isn't so large as to make him confront us as an adult equal. Fourteen is a portrait of both a person and of male adolescence itself.

Katherine French, Director Emerita of Danforth Museum, in her juror's statement for Off the Wall, June 2015, writes: Memory and imagination in representational art is an interest of this curator, and poetic reinterpretation of memory certainly plays a key role in (these artists and their work). This is especially true of Coming and Going...each display the artists' virtuosic ability to go beyond facility in order to extract a deeper, more resonant meaning by filtering it through emotion.

Ellen Grimm, The Sunday Nashua Telegraph: "Grace" is a luminous painting of a girl, perhaps pre-teen, dressed for the summer, sitting in a slightly awkward pose with a hunch in her shoulders and hands resting limply in the grass. Near the girl sits a statuesque black cat, with its head turned to its side, as if there is activity of interest outside the picture frame. Schappler fills the undergrowth, in which a few leaves are illuminated, along with a single flower that leans into the scene as if eavesdropping. She uses thick layers of paint, giving the image a certain heft and richness. Near the painting, Schappler has filled a box with laminated postcards, many of well-known paintings in which key elements have been removed, including Mona Lisa's famously elusive face; a fitting image since there is something inscrutable in Schappler's model. Upon close examination, many of these cutout pieces may be found (as collage) in the painting. In the girl's hand is a water jug taken from Vermeer's 'Young Woman with a Jug'. Schappler seems to

pull us in close to examine her painting. As we do, the collage elements become clearer and the painting blurs in abstraction, with the girl's orange blanket becoming a heap of folds, like the interior of a flower.

Inez McDermott, professor and art historian: This compelling portrait provides a wonderful juxtaposition of colors, patterns, and objects. The placement of the figure and its ambitious size and perspective are bold choices. (Day Begins)

Jeanne McCartin, Curator for Gallery 100, Portsmouth, NH: These works are technically exquisite but lose nothing of their emotional life to technique. They are powerful for their size and emotional impact.

Ellen Grimm, The Nashua Telegraph, p.1 Among the few figure paintings in the show is "The Children" by Patricia Schappler, a striking portrait of three pre-teens sitting poolside against a backdrop of rose vines. Schappler heightens colors so light and shadow have almost sculptural heft and form. Schappler captures the children's individuality while avoiding the pitfall of idealizing them.

Rich Mckown, Art New England: *Producing innovative work, Patricia Schapplers' lush painting with collage, (titled) In the Garden of Eden, flows easily between its three panels.* 

Ellen Grimm, The Nashua Telegraph September 14,:In Madrigal, Schappler has created walk-in collage painting of a

forest scene with slender trees and branches slung like cables...in some areas she seems to have caught the very moment that falling leaves settle on the ground.

Staci Milbouer, Telegraph Staff: *Patricia's work fills the huge walls in the Gallery as if created for that purpose, (they hold) a real treat in store. She is no stranger to the Center, having taught there...these are her trademark, large, graphite drawings. These portraits (are) relentless examinations of their subjects...* 

Ellen Grimm, The Nashua Telegraph: In (Kimono) there is a quiet mischief at work in Patricia Schappler's Kimono, a dramatic triptych painting-collage. On one side is a burst of flowers, barely contained...with a kind of sinuous energy. Even some of the shadows seem alive, as if on the verge of crawling off into the thicket...this is no ordinary garden...

Alice Fuld, Keene Sentinel, take for example, (Schappler's) Unfoldings, two large, bold drawings...were handsome enough, skillfully done, but in this case, a second closer look revealed a lot. First of all, the work was in layers. Some of the figures were composed of one layer over another, neatly meshed so that viewed from afar they appeared to be on one level. In addition, the artist had scrawled barely legible written messages in pencil over the drawing...something was going on in this work, a tale was being told, that I'd missed...

Cynthia Jones: Schappler has combined graphite, pastel and charcoal groups of Michelangelo sized figures in various poses from which emanates massive strength...Unguarded, enigmatic features inspire a feeling of secretly entering a

garden scene. Schappler deftly combines reality with symbolism in a vista that shows her ability to capture with the simplest of the artists' tools, life's sturdiness.
